



Accreditation process

All registered participants will be provided with a photo accreditation.

The accreditation process is one of the most vital steps that each sport must undertake before the start of competition each day. Accreditation desks will be open no later than 45 minutes prior to the first match of the day.

NO ACCREDITATION = NO PLAY

- Upon arrival to the venue, participants present their accreditation pass to the accreditation check-in.
- The participant will be checked in for that day by competition management and receive a sport stamp on their wrist.
- 3. Match officials will check stamps with the assistance of volunteers, prior to students taking the field of play for each match.

NO STAMP = NO PLAY

- 4. All players are to be checked in at least 30 minutes before their first match.
- If a participant's stamp has disappeared after their first game, they can be restamped at check-in by presenting their accreditation.



If a student loses their accreditation they will be required to purchase a new one for \$20.00 from Nationals HQ, located at Gold Coast Sports & Leisure Centre, Carrara.

Competition guidelines

Men and women

UniSport Australia (UniSport) rugby 7s competitions are conducted in accordance with World Rugby (WR) Laws of the Game as outlined in the seven-a-side variations except where these differ from UniSport competition guidelines; in which case the latter shall take precedence. Reference should also be made to the UniSport breach of competition requirements guideline for penalties related to breaches.

1. Team/squad size

- Minimum registered players 10
- Maximum registered players 12 for men. 14 for women
- Maximum cross registrations 3
- Minimum number of players that can take the field without incurring a forfeit - 7
- 1.1. All registered participants must be 18 years of age or older on the day they take the field in the competition in line with Rugby Australia requirements.

2. Competition format

2.1. Substitutions

- 2.1.1. A team may nominate no more than five replacements / substitutes, during a match.
- 2.1.2. No replacement or substitution may be made except with the permission of the referee, and only during a stoppage in play.

2.2. Law variations

2.2.1. The standard set of variations in relation to WR Law 13 "kick off and restart kicks", and WR Law 21 "penalty and free kicks" apply, except that all infringements at a kick off by the kicking team as specified below will result in a free kick at the centre of the half way line awarded to

the non-offending team:

- a) Ball not reaching opponents 10m line, unless first played by an opponent
- b) Ball kicked directly into touch
- c) Players of the kickers team in front of the ball when it is kicked
- d) Ball kicked into in-goal where it is immediately made dead by the non-kicking team, or the ball becomes dead by crossing the touch-in-goal or dead ball lines

2.3. Game duration

All games will be two x seven minutes in duration with one minute for half time.

2.4. Pool points scoring

Points for each match shall be awarded as follows:

Winning team: 3 points

Drawn match: 2 points per team

Losing team: 1 pointForfeited team: 0 points

2.5. Pool tiebreakers

In the event that two or more teams have the same number of points at the completion of the preliminary rounds, the higher placed team(s) will be decided when the first of the following criteria in order, favours one team:

- a) The team that won the match between the teams
- b) The margin of points scored for and against a team in all pool matches
- c) The margin of tries scored for and against a team in all pool matches
- d) The team that has scored the highest number of points in the pool matches





e) The team that has scored the highest number of tries in the pool matches

2.6. Drawn matches

- 2.6.1. If preliminary matches are drawn at full time, both teams will be awarded two points as per section 5.1.
- 2.6.2. If progression or medal matches are drawn at the end of normal time, extra time will be played and the team that scores first will be declared the winner.
- 2.6.3. Extra time will be in periods of five minutes. After each period the teams will change ends without interval.
- 2.6.4. The team that first kicked off will do so again in the first period of extra time. and subsequent kick offs will alternate between the two sides.

3. Team duties

- 3.1. Team duty requirements for rugby 7s are:
- Each team will be rostered to provide a duty team for a number of matches over the duration of the championships.
- The duty team will consist of four people from one team to fill the roles of assistant referee (x2) and ball person (x2).
- 3.2. The person fulfilling the team duty requirements can be any competent person associated with that team or university and does not necessarily have to be a player e.g. team manager.

4. Uniform requirements

4.1. In addition to the requirements outlined in the World Rugby Laws of the Game 2019 (Law 4), the following requirements also apply:

5. Forfeits, delays and abandonments

- 5.1. A forfeit will be declared two minutes after the scheduled start of play time where either team is unable to commence play.
- 5.2. The forfeit score is 35 points to nil (0).
- 5.3. Should the commencement of a game be delayed due to no fault of either team (as determined by the competition management or UniSport), the game shall be played in its full duration if possible. If full game duration is not possible, the recommended revised game duration will need to be agreed upon by both teams. If resolution between the teams is not possible then the competition manager (or their delegate) will make the final decision regarding match format, which will not be subject to appeal.

All competitions will be held in accordance with the UniSport competition guidelines.

Awards

Medals and trophies

Medals are awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place getters (individuals or teams) in each respective sport, with a trophy being presented to the 1st place getters.

Medal and trophy ceremonies will be held at the conclusion of the gold medal match on the field of play. For sports with multiple event categories, medal presentations shall be conducted at the conclusion of each category on the field of play.

Pennants

For each championship won, a pennant is awarded to the university that the winning team or individual students is representing in both Div 1 and 2 competitions. Pennants will be presented on the field of play.

For a sport to be classified as a pennant. four teams from four different universities must be entered into the competition.

For Rugby 7's, the following pennants will be awarded:

- Men's Div 1 & Div 2
- Women's Div 1

Overall awards

There are four overall awards presented to the winning universities. The awards are as follows:

Overall Champion University

Based on the number of pennants (championships) won across all sports. This award will be presented at the end of the year upon the completion of Div 1.

Doug Ellis Per Capita Champion University

Based on points accrued and enrolment numbers of the universities. This award will be presented at the end of the year upon the completion of Div 1 and 2.

Tom O'Sullivan Spirit Trophy

Recognises the university that has shown the best sportsmanship and has captured the spirit of the 2019 Nationals Div 2 competition.

John White Spirit Trophy

Recognises the university that has shown the best sportsmanship and has captured the spirit of the 2019 Nationals Div 1 competition.

Closing show

All medals, trophies and pennants will be presented on the field of play upon the completion of the match. The Nationals Div 1 wrap show will be streamed online at 6pm on Thursday, where the Div 1 Spirit winners will be announced.

Anti-doping control

UniSport condemns doping as fundamentally contrary to the spirit of sport, with anti-doping programs seeking to preserve what is intrinsically valuable about sport.

All participants are bound by the <u>UniSport</u> <u>Illicit Drugs in Sport Policy</u> & the <u>UniSport</u> <u>Anti-Doping Policy</u>, which is approved by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) who have legislative authority to investigate possible violations of the anti-doping rules under the *ASADA Act 2006*.

ASADA offer a free and easy to use online education tool featuring online courses, videos and learning updates. It provides everyone with the opportunity to learn about the key areas of anti-doping such as prohibited substances and methods. All participants – both competitors and noncompetitors are encouraged to complete the Level 1 Anti-Doping Course from the ASADA eLearning website.
